### Research on the Advantages of School-Based Mentoring

Adapted from mentoring.org research corner's article *School based Mentoring* written by Dr. Jean Rhodes

**Reduced Cost:** School-based programs tend to be half as costly per youth than other mentoring programs.

**Advocacy:** When mentors are integrated into the school environment, they are better able to advocate on behalf of their mentees. For example, they can easily speak directly with students' teachers.

**Raising Students' Social Status:** Having a mentor is seen as an "enviable perk" by other students.

**Academic Focus:** The school setting brings academic issues to center stage and provides a natural context for mentors to delve into school and learning issues.

**Reaching Higher Risk-Children:** School-based mentoring programs enrollment procedures are less difficult making it possible for youth whose family situation may prevent them from being involved in programs that require greater family involvement. This implies that school-based mentoring might, in some cases, be reaching higher-risk children and families.

Martin Luther King was strong, brave, and helpful and so am I.

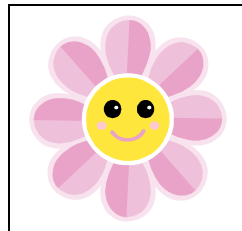
Martin Luther King believed in brotherhood and I believe in sisterhood.
